Sheriff's Lieutenant Accepted into Prestigious White House Fellows Program

(Washington DC) Lieutenant Rita Avila, a Charleston County Sheriff's lieutenant, was recently accepted into the 2019-2020 Class of White House Fellows at the nation's capital. President Lyndon B.
